Safety Outlook **Identity Theft (Part 2)**

Tips on How to Avoid Identity Theft:

- Don't give your credit card or bank account number over the phone unless you initiated the call or you are sure that they are a legitimate business enterprise and you know who you are dealing with.
- Don't give your social security number unless it is absolutely required - for example by the federal or state governments. When completing application forms ask why the business needs your social security number. (Managers usually waive it when customers resist.)
- Secure personal information in your home, especially if you employ outside help or are having work done in your home.
- If you pay your credit card bill by check, write only the last 4 digits of your account number on your check. The company can still identify your account.
- Imprint only your first and middle initial along with your last name on your checks and never imprint your social security number on checks.
- Make photocopies of your ID and frequently used credit cards. Then if they're lost or stolen you can quickly report the loss.
- Shred your bills and other documents that contain personal or account information before throwing them away.

- Reduce the number of credit cards you carry.
- Reduce the number of credit card offers by calling "opt out" at 888-567-8688.
- Check your credit report at least once a year and correct any errors.
- Watch your billing cycle. Call the issuer if you don't receive a new card or your statement.
- Don't carry sensitive information like passwords or your social security card in your wallet or purse.
